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Unified Community Solutions owner <u>Franklin Cook</u> is an independent consultant who speaks and trains nationally on peer support for people bereaved by suicide. He is an inspirational speaker on his own grief recovery after losing his father to suicide, and he customizes practical presentations for local communities and organizations specifically on peer support services and generally on meeting the needs of survivors. Presentations can be organized as a keynote address, conference learning session, or half-day or full-day workshop. Franklin's work as a consultant also includes developing and managing projects focused on community-based support for people bereaved by suicide.

- Supporting the Suicide Bereaved: Lessons Learned from Peer Helpers: Presented a half-day workshop at the <u>Texas Suicide</u> <u>Prevention</u> Symposium on the evidence-based principles and practices of peer support
- Essential Resources for Suicide Bereavement Care: Also at the Texas Sympo-sium, presented a session on the <u>Suicide Grief Support</u> <u>Quick Reference</u>
- Peer Sharing Circles for Suicide Grief Support: Presented a full-day workshop at the TAPS National Military Suicide Survivor Seminar on applying the principles and practices of talking circles to peer-led suicide bereavement support groups

- <u>Suicide Survivor and Bereavement Leadership Summit</u>: Facilitation of a two-day summit involving 20 national experts and leaders in suicide bereavement

- Recommended Guiding Principles for Effective Suicide Bereavement Support Groups: Served on an American Association of Suicidology work group that developed basic guiding principles for support groups
- Survivors of Suicide Loss Task Force: Serving as a member of the National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention task force that is

- developing national guidelines for comprehensive support programs for survivors of suicide loss in the U.S.
- Men's Volunteer Suicide Prevention Advocacy Team: Managing a project for the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, involving a small group of male survivors of suicide who are working on men's suicide prevention in the state
